The results of the study to establish the number of sites should be re-visited as the survey was taken during the peak time for GT activity in the area. The comparison would be surveying Retail footfall figures in the 8 week run up to Christmas and then declaring this was the demand all year around.
Once the figures have been re-validated, if demand remains, then I would brown field sites should be considered that will not fail on the majority of the criteria above or the new housing developments where the key challenges of sustainable services, infrastructure and peaceful integration can be over come.
