

In line with the recent statement from Eric Pickles to protect the Green Belt the options for Gypsy and Traveller sites across warwick District are restricted as approximately 80% of the region is within this designation.

The Communities and Local Government - Planning Policy for traveller sites - Policy B paragraph 9(c) calls for a duty between neighbouring authorities to cooperate (especially where there are planning constraints). I feel this possibility to work with other authorities should be further investigated.

A Gypsy Traveller site (with planning permission) exists in Stratford District Council Region at Black Hill on the A 439 approximately 4 Km from Longbridge.

The changes to allow development to take place where villages are currently washed over by Green Belt needs to be carefully controlled. Parish Councils being very familiar with their particular district have local knowledge which must be given considerable weight where new Green Belt boundaries are to be considered.

All alterations to the Green Belt should be Kept to an absolute minimum so as to prevent development encroaching into the surrounding countryside (a highly valued and non renewable resource).

Strong policy to control disproportional large extensions would ensure a mix of dwelling size would continue throughout the plan period.

The number of new homes within the very small villages and hamlets would need to be very carefully managed and proportionate to the size of the current settlements. New homes within the settlement envelope, of good design, could be successfully integrated with current dwellings.

I could not support housing on the periphery of small villages and hamlets as this would represent encroachment and loss of openness in the Green Belt. Parts of the Green Belt within Shrewley Parish came under pressure with the opening of the 1740. If new homes were to be built on the edge of current settlements this could only further increase pressure on the Green Belt leading to encroachment into the wider countryside.
