I strongly appose the District Council proposals to build on the land between Warwick , Whitnash and Bishop's Tachbrook the land is rural and agricultural and the present policies respect this. This green land is as important as the Green Belt to the north of Leamington and Warwick and should be just as strongly safeguarded.

The National Planning Policy Framework requires the approval of sustainable development which meets an established housing need, planning applications already made or imminent for much of the land meet neither of these criteria.

A realistic forecast of need would mean that the District already has the required five year supply of sites to balance housing needs with employment growth and matching the housing market.

Stratford District Council have a planning application to build 1900 and houses in the area of Gaydon and Lighthorne which should be taken into consideration.

The possible Gipsy and Traveller Sites are going to be concentrated in the same area and again I object because a strong protection given to the Green Belt and so little to our green land it just seem the District Council just want to dump it all on the South Warwick.

Air Pollution and Transport
