1) The land in question, originally a stone quarry dating back to 1768, is owned by Cubbington freeholders on behalf of Cubbington Village. A very active Charity, income from the land has been used in the past to make grants for the good of the parish and village based community organisations. Loss of this income would have a detrimental effect on the village, as land sale proceeds are highly unlikely to be able to be invested and give a similar return. The charity would effectively cease.

2) The proposed site is not on a public transport route and would mean cars joining an already busy road at a difficult spot. Leicester Lane and the Coventry Road/Ryton Road crossroads have had several accidents, some of which fatal, occur. The traffic needs calming not increasing in volume.
