Formal objection to developments at
and around Gallows Hill, Banbury
Road and Myton Road Warwick.

We would like to object to the Local Plan - Revised Development Strategy and ask that this be recorded and our comments passed to the ultimate decision making authority.

We list below our objections -

1. The local need is for fewer than 6000 new houses by about 2030. There are already several thousand empty houses in Warwickshire also there are a number of residential developments that have recently been built or started within

close proximity of the proposed developments and they are as yet not sold or occupied.
all of this will put more pressure on all roads in or around both Warwick and Leamington which is already ~~is~~ high and slow moving at peak times.

2. CAR PARKING - there is already a shortage of adequate car parking spaces in ~~and~~ around Warwick and more developments will add to this problem. Currently over 40 cars park on the verge of Gallows Hill.

3. ENVIRONMENT + GAS EMISSIONS - the air quality is already over the guidelines in both Smith St. and Jury St. Warwick. The Local Plan would result in a significant increase in car journeys and traffic congestion in and around Warwick. The detrimental effects on health and buildings as a result of the increase in gas emissions is unsustainable.

4. The rapid growth in population would put heavy pressure on the hospital and schools. The greenfield

Development would be car dependant and unsustainable.

5. Traffic Mitigation Scheme - the proposed mitigation schemes will only result in complete chaos given that the Avon Bridge can only have 2 lanes thus resulting in a bottleneck, particularly at peak periods, when traffic is diverted as a result of an accident on the M40, road works and the need for Emergency vehicles to pass. The accuracy of the assumptions used to predict traffic flows need to be checked.

6. The safety of pedestrians and cyclists are not properly considered in the revised plan. This appears particularly to Myton Road, Banbury Rd. St. Nicholas and Amitt Asts. especially given the number of residents, visitors and road users requiring access to Warwick Castle, St. Nicholas Park Warwick School, Myton School and Coten End School.

7. What special measures are being taken to mitigate the impact of traffic, noise and pollution on

the conservation areas in the light of its architecture, historic, tourist and environmental importance

In summary - its too many houses, in the wrong places, without adequate transport infrastructure and regardless of the impact on the town centre and its people
