The position with regard to schooling is similar with GT03 being outside of the Harbury Harbury Primary School has had recent issues with too many children already. There are Whitnash (over 2 miles away) with limited capacity.

The public transport whilst satisfactory is largely irrelevant as the residents are unlikely their own transport. There is a bus stop on the Harbury Lane however there is no pedest potential site.

GT 03 is located right next to the historic Fosse Way. The road now known as the Fosse W following the Roman invasion in AD 43, nearly 2000 years ago, and has been a major high throughout the centuries. There was a tollhouse on the junction of the Fosse Way and Sout the 17th and 18th centuries. If GT 03 is approved it is important that a major archaeologic take place prior to site work so that the archaeology and heritage of the area can be recover safeguarded.

Urbanisation

GT 03 will involve considerable infrastructure in addition to the actual site. Its proximity t roundabout may require traffic control and road widening to provide a right turning lane for Further features could include bus shelters and a pedestrian crossing and more street lighting needed.
