Criteria by which Gypsy and Traveller's sites will be judged for suitability and sustainability by Warwick **District Council:**

- Convenient access to a GP surgery, school and public transport;
- Avoiding areas with a high risk of flooding;
- Safe access to the road network and provision for parking, turning and servicing on site;
- Provision of utilities (running water, toilet facilities waste disposal etc);
- Avoiding areas where there could be an adverse impact on important features of the natural and historic environment; and,
- Sites which can be integrated into the landscape without harming the character of the area.
- Promotes peaceful and integrated co-existence between the site and the local community;
- Avoids placing undue pressure on local infrastructure and services;
- Reflects the extent to which traditional lifestyles (whereby some travellers live and work from the same location thereby omitting many travel to work journeys) can contribute to sustainability.

Please set out full details of your objection or representation of support with reference to the criteria as outlined by the council.

1 There is no convenient access to a GP surgery, the nearest (Croft Medical Centre, Sydenham) is 3.3 miles and the Primary School in Radford Semele is 1.8 miles - that may have capacity now, but the further 100 houses proposed in the local plan will absorb that and Harbury's is outside the catchment.

2. The site is within 50m of the busy junction of a 'A' and 'B' main roads with high traffic flows at peak times and one of them clearly signed as a High Risk Crash Route. There are no pavements and no provision for bus shelters; the current bus stop is on a grass bank - pedestrian safety particularly that of children will be compromised.

3 There is no main gas, sewerage or drainage at the site and I believe the electricity may not be able to cope. The considerable cost of providing these utilities is clearly a waste of tax-payer's money.

4 The Gypsy & Travellers' site between Tredington and Moreton in Marsh, further south on the Fosse Way is similarly in a valley and at a crossroads; there the similarity ends. One of the roads is a minor one and the site contours mean that it is well screened from the road. This would be impossible at GT02 where 3/4 of the road views are from hills on high. The expression "blot on the landscape" comes to mind, rather than a site which will be integrated into the landscape without harming the character of the area. In addition GT02 is located in a rural setting; residents at the proposed site would far outnumber local residents - hardly a good basis for integration.

Warwick District Council will judge proposed sites against the nationally accepted criteria. The purpose of the criteria is to seek to meet the requirements of the Gypsy and Travellers community not necessarily local residents, businesses and employment.

Areas of concern could include:

• Agriculture • Animal Welfare • Co-existence • Crime • Ecology and Habitat • Education/Schools • Healthcare/
Surgeries • Highways and Safety • Local Economy • Rural Landscape • Services and Utilities • Tourism • Traffic Density/
Flow • Urbanisation.

Quite frankly I am amazed that WDC had the temerity to select the GT02 site in the first place when it already was aware of the business that was being run on the site. Did WDC not consider what the impact would be from Day 1? I believe the Centre has already lost one booking since exhibitions are planned well in advance and no potential user would wish to book a venue that might be closing.

In many ways the Warwickshire Exhibition Centre has taken over from the Stoneleigh Exhibition ground and by so doing it has created a venue that is readily accessible from the M40 rather than putting pressure on the quieter and more rural roads around Stoneleigh. A BENEFIT.

In 2012 it had 33K visitors which could rise to 40K this year; it contributes significantly to the local economy by using local hotels, pubs, restaurants, petrol stations and shops. The very fact that it provides a bus service to Leamington for non-exhibition visitors is indicative of its contribution which is estimated to add some £5m to the local economy over the next 5 years. WDC's consultants, Enfusion have overlooked that adjoining the Centre are 5 other businesses and were it to close in excess 40 jobs could be lost; in fact this is only one example of the consultants' failure to do their job properly. The Open Meeting held at the Centre on 25th June, attended by nearly 400 people including Jeremy Wright MP heard a catalogue of their failures in this respect. The high attendance at an initial meeting is indicative of the local community's depth of resistance to GT02.
