1. To Lapworth's Category 1 status. This is inappropriate and fails to take into account the true nature of our supposed infrastructure links & facilities.
2. To the proposal to build up to 150 homes. The following objections can be raised:
 - a) It would amount to a disproportionate increase in the size of the village
 - b). It would put an unrealistic strain on the current infrastructure
 - c). It would add to the total amount of housing stock currently on the market and not selling.
3. To the redesignation of the proposal as Kingswood instead of Lapworth. This is both unfair and divisive. It is also vague as the exact area denoted as Kingswood is imprecise & also covers more than one administrative area.

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
