

Draft Gypsy and Traveller Site Options

We are appalled to learn that the council is considering building traveller sites in the area round Bishops Tachbrook. There are very many reasons why the area is unsuitable and we are certain the council is aware of these – viz:

There are few local amenities so houses in the area would be completely vulnerable to people for whom there is no outlet for alternative entertainment (i.e. the crime rate would be certain to rise dramatically)

The school would suffer from overcrowding and may not be able to provide enough places for children already living in the village

The beautiful surrounding landscape would be spoiled

The road into Bishops Tachbrook from the south floods regularly in the winter

This is an historic area having once been part of the Warwick Castle Estate and with some beautiful old houses – there may yet be historical remains to be discovered.

There would be far too much pressure on our local infrastructure.

Revised Development Strategy

We feel strongly that the proposal to build 12000 plus houses, 4500 of them south of Warwick, is excessive and would completely spoil this lovely area we live in.

When we moved here in 1985 it was because we wanted to live in a rural area and because we fell in love with our house and greatly appreciated the four hundred year old history attached to it. All this would be ruined by a large number of houses being built on the green land south of Warwick and Whitnash.

There just is no room for more traffic on our roads.

Has the council considered reviving areas of the towns that have become untidy and desolate?

People come to live in areas like Bishops Tachbrook for the same reasons that we did – because they like village life and the proximity of the green fields. We all really appreciated the council stepping in the save Oakley Wood and urge the council to hugely scale down its development plans. Our local survey found that only a handful of houses was required to fulfil the needs of our village population.

We entreat the council to bear these points in mind in its deliberations.
