	Comments on the Village Housing Options proposed for Hill Wootton
	1. I accept that it is necessary to build additional residential units to house the increasing number of inhabitants within this area.  2. I agree that villages and hamlets should do their share of provision of accommodation  3. I do not have an issue with Hill Wootton providing additional housing subject to design, location and being compatible with the shortage of amenities within the hamlet.  4. There are several locations within Hill Wootton which could offer suitable development opportunities.  5. The "preferred" site proposed by the planning authority is a possibility although there is concern about highway matters, and obviously one or two residents will have their views NEUTEAL and amenities interfered with.  6. The proposed development appears to be incompatible with the nature of the village, the housing within the village and the needs of the village. I am not sure for whom the planning of JECT authority are proposing should occupy these residences. It is therefore difficult for me to comment without knowing.  7. If this "low cost housing" is needed for farm workers, then transport is going to be equally difficult for them to reach shops and other facilities – living in Kenilworth would give them lower cost units and more accessible amenities. I do accept that there may be valid reasons for the proposal, but I would like to know what they are and they should be discussed. One person's subsidised housing costs are another person's tax.  8. As with all things, it is the supply and demand for any commodity/property that dictates the price/value. The open market will ultimately decide.  9. Alternative options are possibly available. However, as far as I am aware, no one has been approached and there are "large" gardens which may be suitable for providing housing opportunities, but unlikely to be suitable for low cost housing.
