Dear Tracy Danke, we are writing to your good-self concerning recent mailings to every resident in the Leek Wootton Village, regarding the plan to assess the potential for the future construction of affordable dwellings - 30 to 80 over the next 15 years.

As we lived in the Village some time ago we can offer the following: A hand-drawn rudimentary map to pinpoint the 2 Lane Road, * Clinton Lane - Then, the property known as Clinton Lane Farm in their brick-built dwelling, owned by the family.

The family work for a living and are known in the Village.

Following the Route Map, drive from the Petrol Station (situated within the forecourt) taking the first lane to bring you to the Warwick Road. Then, take the First Right turning into Clinton Lane [a 2-lane Road]. Continue driving until you see, on the right hand side of the Road, a board, advertising hen eggs for sale. The Board reads "Don't Pass - BY a Good egg."

The son of the family is known to be friendly also.

With the aforementioned as a background, we can progress to state the following which refers directly to Rouncil Lane Farm.

Driving slowly past the Rouncil Lane Farm, you will, on your right-hand side, see a large landscape, unfarmed for more years than anyone can remember.

Stop here and walk towards a metal gate, unused and only partially opened, and left as it is for a long time.

We would like to suggest that the area around the gate would be the ideal place to build the dwellings you have in mind.
