IF BARFORD HAS TO TAKE THE NUMBER OF ADDITIONAL HOMES CURRENTLY PROPOSED (70-90), THEN THE THREE PREFERRED OPTIONS ARE THE LEAST UNACCEPTABLE. AT THIS LEVEL OF ADDITIONAL HOMES ONE LARGE SITE WILL BE NECESSARY SINCE THE SMALLER SITES TOGETHER WOULD NOT BE ABLE TO ACCOMMODATE THIS NUMBER. OF THE TWO LARGE SITES AVAILABLE THE SHERBOURNE NURSERY SITE IS LESS DISRUPTIVE OF THE VILLAGE'S SURROUNDING LANDSCAPE THAN THE FORMER BARFORD MOUSE LANDS. ON BALANCE THE TWO SMALLER SITES IN THE PREFERRED OPTIONS ARE ALSO MORE ACCEPTABLE THAN THE DISCOUNTED OPTIONS FOR THE REASONS GIVEN IN THE CONSULTATION BOCUMENT.

HOWEVER, IN ORDER NOT TO BE TOO DISRUPTIVE OF THE VILLAGE'S SOCIAL CONFSION AND SERVICES, IT IS ESSENTIAL THAT THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE SITES IS PHASED OVER THE FULL PERIOD OF THE LOCAL PLAN.

PLANNING APPROVALS FOR THE ADDITIONAL HOMES MUST ALSO ENSURE THAT THE MIX OF TYPES OF DWELLINGS MEETS LOCAL NEEDS AS IDENTIFIED IN THE HOUSING NEEDS SURVEY.
