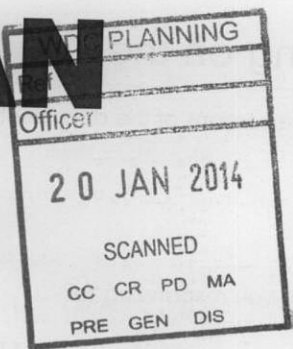

Local plan to build 830 properties in 9 villages will destroy these villages. This is more concentrated than the original plan with 12 villages. Too much pressure will be placed on the infrastructure of roads, schools + amenities.

Brown field sites should be used first.

Village development should be limited to 30/35 new dwellings spread over more locations to ease natural growth of each village to attract young people to their locality.

This would ensure that villages are improved + not just destroyed. Infrastructures would be more able to cope and more locations would be helped.

Burton Green will be spoilt by HS2 as this will bisect the village, spoil the existing village hall and environment. This village is an unsuitable location for 80 new houses though the destroyed amenities will need to be replaced. There has been a lot of development in this area and roads are severely congested at rush hour. If building is done in the village, the proposed location (1 on plan page 41) has to be the preferred location near the school with a new village hall. However 80 homes is out of proportion for a village with 263 residents - an increase of 30%. 35 houses would be more appropriate.
