The two preferred options for Shrewley Common together propose around 20 dwellings which would represent a 20% increase in housing numbers. Currently Shrewley Common settlement consists of around 100 homes in a very linear shape. The two sites are relatively small hawing short road frontages with Shrewley Common Road. To build the number of properties envisaged a degree of backland development would need to take place. This would change the linear character of Shrewley Common. However, a reduced housing number protecting the linear settlement character could be more readily assimilated within the currently built settlement.
