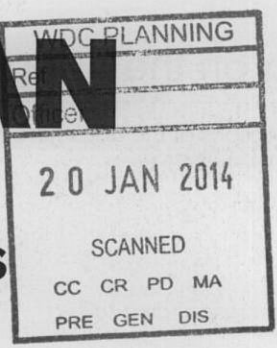

Local plan to build 830 properties in 9 villages will destroy these villages. In fact it is even more concentrated than original plan with 12 villages. These villages do not have the infrastructure to cope; i.e. roads, schools & amenities

Brown field sites should be used first. Village development should be limited to 30/35 new dwellings spread over many more locations to enable natural growth of each village to attract young people to their locality. This would ensure villages are improved & not destroyed & infrastructures would cope while helping many more locations. This point has been made throughout this plan by current residents & completely ignored again.

Burton Green is going to be destroyed by HS2 - bisecting the village, forcing destruction of village hall and its environs. The whole village is blighted by it!

The village is not a location for 80 new houses, though obviously the destroyed amenities & houses will need to be replaced. Even without HS2 local infrastructure will not cope. 250 houses already built within few miles and traffic queues throughout village at rush hours.

If building is done in the village the proposed location (1 on plan page 41) has to be the preferred location near the school with a new village hall. However 80 new homes is out of proportion for a village of only 263 residences. This is an increase of 30%. 35 houses is reasonable and in fact 6 new houses have been built on the edge of the village and improved the environment.

Contrary to the majority of residents requested the number of houses has increased from 30/80 originally to now 70/90. Who will want to live here with HS2 bisecting the village?
