Part B. Commenting on the village housing options for Leek Wootton

Food security. 10 years from now the world population will have increased by another 700 million. Will they give us their food? Britain can only feed 40% of its people today. It is total madness to build on any field capable of producing food such as options 1,7,8,9,10,11,12,13. Indeed some such as Option 10 are prime quality agricultural land.

Part C. Commenting on the indicative Settlement Boundaries for Leek Wootton.
