

I object to the proposal of converting the allotments into a housing development. I was not aware until the 12th of January of any proposals to develop this area, which I found surprising, in view of the amount of very positive information we had for the development of the social housing, using the corner of the field off Coverts Rd. next to the Mayfair Securities site which I felt was very positive. Having looked at the planned site, I have to admit to some confusion, the site marked '2' does not use the field up to the field boundaries, I would like an explanation as to why! The amount of unused field would appear to amount to the allotment site! This allotment site produces food for local families which I had thought, in view of Mr Cameron's 'Big Community' was important. At no place in the planning document do I see any plan for where the allotments would be re-sited, at the moment people walk to their allotment, and when would this happen.

I had not been aware during the consultation for local social housing that there was a need for 150 houses in this area; and I do feel that so many houses in such an area would create issues for the local schools.

In the planning document I notice that public transport has been noted as generally 13-17 min this is not what we find. The latest bus from Leamington is about 6.30 pm not good for returnees from work, therefore the amount of traffic on Coventry Rd and the junction with Rugby Rd would be much increased and become dangerous.

Nowhere in the document does it mention the type of houses it is proposed to build which also has an impact on the area.

I would wish for a meeting with planners to discuss this further;
