This would make it extremely dangerous for pedestrians (children especially). Lots of accidents happen at this junction already without the addedrisk of caravans turning in and out of the site!

The site would not be close to aumenities it schools, shops a doctors surgeries. - The doctors surgery and school in Harbury are both full to capacity. Translers would need to drive to Harbury - making it non eco-friendly not to mention the parking problems already experienced in Harbury Village centre!

The local school and Doctors are also under pressure from the new houses that have been built in Bush Heath Lame and these fauchies should get priority!! Some families have had to enrole their children at school in Bishops Itchington as they cannot get in at Harbury School. Howbury Lane is prone to flooding and that could be a problem as the pout of the football field site and surrounding fields are often underwater.
