## Part B - Commenting on the Stratford Road Gypsy and Traveller Preferred Site

The policy in the Draft Local Plan will list the criteria by which Gypsy and Traveller sites will be judged for suitability and sustainability. These are the criteria:

- a) the site is within reasonable distance of schools, GP surgeries, dentists, hospitals, shops and community facilities;
- b) the site has good access to the major road network;
- c) the site is of a suitable size to accommodate between 5 and 15 pitches for permanent sites or 12 pitches for transit sites;
- d) it can be demonstrated that infrastructure requirements can be adequately met;  
and
- e) there is potential for the site to be adequately screened.

First of all I would like to object to the consultation process which has in my opinion been very poor. Local people were not directly informed by the council of these plans. The two drop in surgeries organized at Chase Meadow Community Centre were very insufficient and stopped at 6.30 p.m. and wrong information was given. Also WDC planners declined to attend the Aylesford School meeting organized by the CMRA even when invited by both the CMRA and our local MP Chris White who did attend.

Also I consider the response criteria above to be too restrictive for our responses so I will just state my objections in a straightforward and unfettered way.

Here are my reasons for objecting to this site.

### Access

I know this site very well as I travel along the farm track several times a week to see my daughter who lives at The Barn House next to Longbridge Farm. She is a single mother with two children aged 2 and 5. The gypsy and traveller site would be in the next field to the Barn House and I am obviously concerned for the impact this large development would have on the quality of her life. She obviously uses the farm track regularly to take the children to nursery and school and for every other purpose. The farm track is only a single track and there are only short areas to pass small vehicles on the track bends. Having large gypsy vehicles going up and down this farm track would be a nightmare for her to deal with on a daily basis. The track is unsuitable for heavy usage as it is not hard surfaced and needs regular maintenance even for the small amount of traffic currently using it.

### Traffic Hazard

Traffic turning right off the Stratford Road have a difficult job seeing traffic coming from the direction of Warwick as it is almost a blind bend with longer views obscured by trees and shrubs. Slow moving turning vehicles with long trailers would be a serious extra hazard at this accident black spot.

### Flood Risk

The designated field was partially flooded during the 1998 floods that hit Warwick and Leamington. This would be a grave risk for people in single storey dwellings such as those used by gypsies and travellers as they would not be able to go upstairs to escape from the water. During the 1998 floods many caravans from the holiday parks around

Stratford were swept into the River Avon and people had to be rescued by boats and even helicopters. These severe floods seem to occur about every 25 years on this stretch of the River Avon and it is not possible to alleviate this grave flood risk when rivers burst their embankments. The flood plain on the Warwick Castle grounds on the other river side to the proposed site was totally submerged.

### **Setup Costs**

It is not clear from the plan who will bear the set up costs for the site which will be considerable and could cost the local council a lot of money that the council can ill afford in these times of austerity. For example who will pay for the cost of the land, landscaping, improved road access and maintenance, connection to utilities etc.

### **In Summary**

I think this is a badly chosen site which has been pounced on as a last chance just in order to get the Local Plan approved. It also seems that all the three sites chosen lie in the Warwick District and there are no sites in Leamington or Kenilworth Districts.
