- The children's play area at the Village Hall would become dangerous as it would be next to an
 access road and suffer from the significant resultant increase in traffic to the new houses. Even if
 appropriate fences could be put in place to prevent children from running out into the road (and
 from a health and safety point of view this is unlikely), a playground on the corner of a junction
 can hardly be described as a safe and sensible option to be endorsed.
- Barcheston Drive is too narrow for lorry and heavy plant movements during any construction
 phase. The bus (vital for the community) already struggles to negotiate the traffic calming
 features (which are a necessity from a health and safety perspective), particularly with the
 presence of parked cars. They may also be obliged to use the grass verges and pathways,
 presenting a danger to pedestrians and destroying the established walkways and cycle paths.
 Notwithstanding the damage to the community wellbeing, this also presents a significant health
 and safety concern and parties should be mindful of this.
- Proposed access from the village hall car park is very steep. In order to provide sufficient road infrastructure to counteract the steep gradient additional land above that highlighted in the proposal would need to be acquired. This will impact on the village hall, the neighbouring play area, the planted orchard (for which the community has invested significant time and resource), sports facilities and the number of parking spaces available for the community village hall. Additional car parking would also need to be provided to compensate the loss of spaces as the proposed access is through the village hall car park. This would bring further problems for the infrastructure and wellbeing of Hatton Park and its residents.
- Birmingham Road will struggle to support the additional traffic inevitably generated by the
 occupiers of 55 new homes. At peak times the road is already heavily congested with
 commuters, traffic avoiding the M40, parents driving children to and from school etc. Short
 journeys into Warwick are already taking a significant time because of the excessive traffic, and
 this would only get significantly worse.
- There have been a number of fatalities and serious accidents on the Birmingham Road in recent years and an increase in traffic volume will increase the likelihood of these occurring.
- The site is unsustainable environmentally as the lack of local infrastructure (public transport, schools, shops) requires additional car use and therefore does not comply with the National Planning Policy Framework's requirement to secure sustainable development.
- The Local Plan has not identified the necessary infrastructure needed to support the level of new residential development for the sites allocated in the Plan, for example, new schools, health facilities and a better road infrastructure.
- Finally, there is no sound basis to remove the green belt as a result of so-called "special circumstances" to support additional housing needs.
