7. Please give details of why you consider the Proposed Modifications to the Submission Warwick District Local Plan are not legally compliant or are unsound. Please be as precise as possible. I believe that the extension of the Local Plan to involve fields on land East of Cubbington designated in the plan as H50 is neither legal nor sound for a number of reasons.

Firstly this is land designated as Green Belt and the National Planning Policy Framework states that green belt boundaries should only be altered in exceptional circumstances and these are not set out convincingly in relation to this particular modification.

I then have a number of concerns about the assessment made as to the choice of this site and its affects on the village and its community.

The most serious is that the assessment acknowledges that the steeply sloping site is adjacent to an area of flood risk in the existing village due to surface water run off into a brook called the Pingle. This is confirmed in the Environment Agency Flood Maps (latest edition 2013). In the assessment it states that sufficient mitigation will be available (using a Sustainable Urban Drainage scheme (SUDS)). It does not make clear whether this has been fully assessed by the Environment Agency since over £0.9 Million was spent early in 2013 to provide an second mitigation scheme for the existing problem following a failure of the first mitigation scheme in 2007 resulting in extensive flooding of houses adjacent to the Pingle. I am not convinced that these houses would not be put at more risk from run off from a new housing estate on this field.

I would propose that plans to build on site H50 should be abandoned both as no justification has been made for its removal from the Green Belt and the risk of the development severely affecting the existing village and its community as set out above.

I believe that building on sites H25 and H26 would provide sufficient housing for local needs in the village and that these will already have significant affects on village infrastructure.
