I am writing as a resident of Hampton on the Hill to object to the proposed new houses to be built at Hampton Magna.

An increase of nearly 40% is a lot, The school is already full and the services overloaded.

It will require substantial investment in extending all amenities to accommodate the additional housing.

The situation is made worse by the development at Chase Meadow. Many people there use Hampton Magna as a short cut to Warwick Parkway and the A46 and A4177. At busy

Times it can be very difficult to cross the road through the village if you have a pram, or as I do a very slow dog.

If extra houses were to be built at Hampton Magna, it would be essential to build a separate road into them from the A4189 Henley Road and factor in the costs of doing so.
