Firstly Barcheston Drive is too narrow for laries and heavy plant machinery movements during the construction. The number 166 already struggles to negotiate the traffic coliming features, particularly with the numbers parked cars. If they have to use the grass verges and pathways, this will be a danger to pedestrians and destroyed (see separate short) pathways.

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27 The proposed access from the village hall is extremely steep. In order to provide sufficient road infrastructure to counteract the steep gradient additional land above that highlighted in the proposal would need to be acquired. This will impact the village hall , the neighbouring playground, planted orchard, sports facilities and the number of parking spaces available for the sillage hall. Additional carparking would also need to be provided to compensate the loss of spaces as the proposed access is through the sillage hall car park. 31 The childrens play area would become dangerous as it would be next to an access road and the increase of traffic to the new navos. Fencing would need to be put up to prevent children from running out into the road. also a children's playground on the corner of a junction can hardly be described

as safe and sonsible.

The wider infraestructure (Birmingham Road) will struggle to support the additional traffic menitably generated by the occupien of 55 homes. The road is already congested at peak times with parents driving to and from school so well so coaches picking the children up to take them to schools outside the area.

5) From a wider enewpoint the projections for having need in the region are based on a blip in demand and growth will not necessarily follow the same trajectory, hence we may not need as many houses as forecast. We also question the decision to remove the green belt as a result of so called "special circumstances" to support additional housing needs.

environmentally as the lack of local infrastructure (public transport - schools-shopes) requires additional car use and therefore does not comply with the national Planning Policy Framework's requirement to secure sustainable development.

The Local Plan has not identified the necessary infrastructure needed to support the level of new residential development for the sites allocated in the Plan, for example, new schools, health facilities and a better road infrastructure
