I have already submitted a letter objecting to your proposals to violate the Green Belt for development purposes, but another consideration has now drawn itself to my attention.

In this, the Queen's Jubilee Year, the Queen Elizabeth II Fields Challenge aims to create a network of outdoor spaces as a lasting reminder of the year. As well as sports grounds and recreation areas, this includes green spaces. If parks and fields continue to disappear at the present rate, many communities will have no rural areas for their residents to enjoy.
