This clearly implies modest growth in villages but we were informed at the Local Councillar Presentation that between 30 x 80 homes would be built in Norten Lindsey, or more precisely the part of the village that talls under the control of Warrich D.C. 80 Romes increases the village size by more than 50%, 30 homos represents almost 20% and this assumes no more houses to be built in the third of the village that falls under Stratford control (where 2 new developments of 'affordable' housing Rowe already been built). It is extensive and worst of all completely disproportionate when compared to the proposed impact as towns.
