

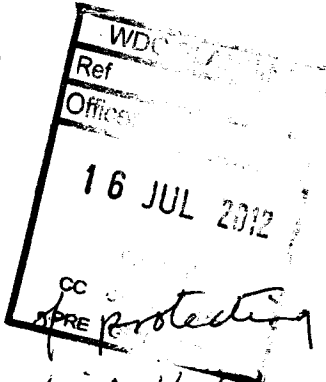

Re - "Protect our Green Belt,"

Dear Sir,



I am one of the supporters of protecting our Green Belt land. It is essential that we keep all the Rural areas to maintain the production of much needed Food, Worldwide, & to keep areas in the fresh air, for leisure activities, mainly Walking & Hiking & Cycling.

I consider that the first priority for building Houses/Flats, is, Where is the Employment to be found? and where will the Car Parking facilities be?

Thus, I suggest that "Brown Fields Sites" are developed, especially in the Centre of Town where so many shops & offices have closed, & the 2 or 3 floors above could be

made into Flats. Also, many Houses that come up for Sale have Gardens large enough to allow for 2 Semi-detached to be built to replace the one - it seems fewer people (especially older people) want only a small garden now. Also, many older, now-single people, would exchange the large family house, for a smaller one, given some incentive e.g. a grant to move.

I appreciate that some additional Housing is required, & probably Developers are mainly looking to make a profit which probably comes easier by starting on an open space, but I consider this very much against the Community as a whole.

Thus I trust that when Warwick District Council know how we are all supporting the retention of our beloved Countryside, they will convince the developers that they must look inwards i.e. to all the available "Brown Field Sites".
