This statement seems to contradict itself, i.e. it talks of providing sustainable forms of transport but applying to increase road capacity to deal with congestion. I would want to see much more detailed information on what 'improvements' actually mean (? dualing the A452) and where does all the traffic go after speeding into Leamington. I feel the North Leamington Relief Road will damage the area in many ways. The North Leamington Park & Ride seems rather misplaced as already 12 buses per hour come through the Thickthorn Roundabout to Leamington - could consideration be given to locating it at Thickthorn.

I appreciate you are under an obligation to comply with Government policy but the ^{term} long damage to Leamington's unique culture & environment must not be lost.

By bundling close to existing services you are at odds with Preceding Statement, i.e. wanting to avoid growth which could lead to existing settlements merging'. The loss of green belt disadvantages people who moved here because of the easy access (ie by foot/bike) to open countryside, as well as future generations. Unless new schools/shops/employment precede housing people will continue to travel to existing services. Your scheme inevitably puts more strain on existing road network & therefore justifies increasing road capacity (see response to PO14). Employment is a diverse need & the statement assumes it 'will be close to or part of' new housing is unsubstantiated in my view. This could be better met by increasing the settlement at Hatten due to its close proximity to Warwick Parkway & junction for A46, thus giving good access to wider areas of employment.
