The number of houses in the "historic parish" of Norton Lindsey has increased by 50 per cent in the last 30 years from 97 in 1981 to 145 in 2011. [These figures ignore developments of Norton Lea and Wolverton Fields, in Wolverton parish, and Morgan Close and Brickkiln Close, in Claverdon parish, which are contiguous with the built-up area of Norton Lindsey.]

Parts of the infrastructure of the village cannot withstand the continued growth rate of the last 30 years. There is no shop or post office. Bus services consist of 2 buses a week to Stratford and 2 buses per week to Solihull, one of which requires a telephone call to pick up in the village! The village hall is already too small for the current population of the village. The sewage works, which also serves Wolverton, was built in 1971 with a capacity for a combined population of 600.

The Local Plan classifies Norton Lindsey as a category 2 village which envisages 30-80 houses being built 2014-2029. That would mean a growth of between 21% and 55% in 16 years which, I believe, is not sustainable.

The scale of development in the last 30 years has threatened to undermine the unique character of the village as it has struggled to assimilate all the newcomers. Norton Lindsey is arguably the last, relatively unspoilt, hill-top village in Warwick District. If its character and ethos, manifest in its community spirit, are to be given a chance of survival, there is a strong argument for limiting the further growth of Norton Lindsey 2014-29 to a maximum of 15-20 houses.

In short, a rethink of the village categories is needed via introduction of category 3 villages.
