once you have built your 770 houses and filled all the green space with concrete and tarmae and bulldosed the great fragrant how thom heages surrounding it, Thick thorn will indeed be a BROWN area - just as indicated on your map. Your proposals sound like a development of a small town within the existing market town of Kerilworth - which has already reached its optimum size.

As for freen Belt - it will simply become distant trees and fields viewed from the windows of a cas or bus.
