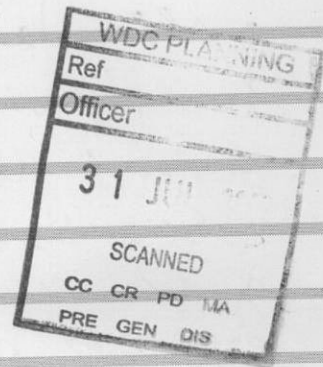

The discussion of economic growth in the Summary is inadequate, although it is pleasing that it is referred to in conjunction with the extra housing which seemed to take up all the discussion at the North Leamington Community Forum. There is a need to spell out where this growth is coming from, how much there is going to be and what is being done to expand the local economy.

Secondly, where PO8 refers to the map on page 8, it does not discuss one key issue which is very obvious at first sight. The development sites to the north are likely to lead to Leamington, Warwick and Kenilworth being turned into one urban area by sites 4, 5, 7 and 9 being developed. Urban spread would be a very real issue (the last line of para 1 of PO3)

The sites to the south are also likely to cut residents there off from the countryside and countryside views they currently enjoy and they are much to be preferred.
