Gypsy and Traveller Site Options Response Form 2013 Site GT20 Land at Junction 15 of the M40

We write on behalf of the owner of the land edged red on the attached plan, Mr I Wyatt of Hampton Lodge Farm, Henley Rd, Warwick, CV35 8QT, to object to the proposed location of Gypsy Site GT20 land at junction 15 of the M40.

We note that the site has been assessed in your Warwick Local Plan Final Interim SA Report however would make the following comments based on the selection criteria within your consultation document Sites for Gypsies and Travellers paragraph 7.3.

- 1. The site is in a rural location some 3 miles from services. There is no public transport linking the site with any areas of significant population. There are no footpaths on the adjacent public highways for pedestrian access.
- 2. A significant part of the option area is shown by the Environment Agency as an area which is prone to flood and for this reason that part is unsuitable.
- 3. Any travellers' site would be accessed off the busy B4463. This road is used by commuters to reach the M40 motorway and vehicles travel at a fast speed. Access for slow moving vehicles from any proposed traveller's site onto the public highway would be dangerous, especially those towing trailers. Again for this reason it is considered unsuitable.
- 4. The site is located adjacent to the M40 motorway and the A46 major trunk road. There is a significant amount of noise nuisance from this road network. This site has been proposed previously for a traveller's site and was turned down as the level of onsite noise exceeded the level permissible under the Human Rights Act. We see the NAEA NAEA

circumstances have changed, if anything the road network is busier and the noise nuisance greater. On the basis that it has previously been turned down on this issue it should not be considered as an option to take forward again.

- 5. There are no utilities connected to the land and the connection of any utility would be expensive. We understand there are no main sewers in the vicinity of the proposed site. It would be necessary to lay pipes either beneath the M40 or the A46 which would be at a prohibitive cost. Again for this reason the site should not be taken forward.
- 6. The land is Green Belt and open in character. It is not possible to integrate the site into the landscape without harming the character of the area. Again for this reason the site should not be selected for further consideration.

There are also additional criteria we feel should be taken into consideration in addition to your criteria contained within the National Guidance Planning Policy for Traveller sites March 2012 and National Planning Policy Framework when considering the suitability of sites as these would have to be considered if a formal planning application were submitted.

The National Guidance Planning Policy for Traveller sites March 2012 gives the following guidance to Local Authorities:

1. Local planning authorities should ensure that sites do not dominate the nearest settled community. This proposed location is rural countryside some distance from the boundary of a settlement. The proposed site will be alien in the environment to the surrounding features. For this reason it should not be taken forwards

2. Green Belt: The National Guidance Planning Policy for Traveller sites March 2012 acknowledges travellers sites are inappropriate development in the Green Belt. This site is Green Belt. It further states that they should not be approved except in very special circumstances. No case has been made that there are exceptional circumstances therefore it should not be taken forwards.

3. Mixed residential and business sites: The National Guidance Planning Policy for Traveller sites March 2012 states regard should be had to sites suitable for mixed residential and business uses to allow residential accommodation and space for storage of equipment, however these should not be on a rural exception site. This would be a rural exception site and therefore inappropriate for a mixed use. It further states that local planning authorities should not permit mixed use on rural exception sites. Your consultation document suggests all sites will be mixed used and again for this reason this is an inappropriate site for a traveller site.


4. Development in open countryside: The National Guidance Planning Policy for Traveller sites March 2012 states that local planning authorities should strictly limit new travellers site development in open countryside that is away from existing settlements or outside areas allocated in the development plan. This site is in open countryside and therefore in contravention of this guidance. Again this shows this site is appropriate.

In addition National Planning Policy Framework offers guidance on development in the Green Belt. This proposed site is within the green belt and has been allocated as such by Warwick District Council. As such it is classed as important to prevent inappropriate development and urban sprawl. Inappropriate development should only be approved if there are exceptional circumstances. None have been outlined. No site should be approved within the green belt without justification that there are exceptional circumstances. It is hard to believe that there are no suitable brown field sites available within town boundaries as opposed to on green belt land. Unless it can be shown that there are no suitable brown field sites no sites should be taken forward within the green belt or open countryside. Again the site should not be put forward for this reason.

For the above reasons we do not consider site GT020 is an appropriate site for a traveller and gypsy site and it should not be considered by the District Council as an appropriate site to take forward.

#### **GYPSY AND TRAVELLERS SITE OPTIONS SITE GT02**

I wish to object to the proposed site GT02 located on the Fosse Way at its junction with the A425.

Addressing the criteria by which you will judge this I would like to point out that in most instances the proposed site will not meet same. As regards the GP Surgery although the Enfusion report states that there is one within 1.5 miles this is totally incorrect the nearest is 3.3 miles and is fully subscribed with the next one, Cubbington Road Surgery, being 4.7 miles distant. Clearly this is not convenient nor indeed is it on a direct bus route. Schools are also further than stated and are already near capacity and likely to be so when the housing suggested in the local plan is built in Radford Semele.

As regards the location of the site itself and safe access to the roadway network I would point out that the site chosen is very close to the junction of two major roads which, at peak times, sees over 2000 vehicle movements per hour. Consequently the site and its residents would be subject to a higher level of noise and air pollution than would be desirable and access and egress of a large number of resident's vehicles would be on to busy roads which could result in traffic accidents. For the residents, particularly young children, being located so close to such busy roads is both unsafe and unhealthy, a further concern for the children's safety is that the Grand Union Canal is relatively close by.

In respect of services and facilities the site is ill served as there is no mains drainage or mains gas in the area and furthermore it is on a limited rural electricity line which will possibly not meet the increased requirements or if it does will affect power available to established residences and local businesses. It would therefore, contrary to the criteria, place undue pressure on local infrastructure and services.

The criteria seeks to avoid areas where a site could have an adverse impact and requires that the site should be integrated into the landscape without harming the character of the area. Clearly such a large 15 pitch site located in the foot of the valley will be visible from all directions and will be a major intrusion into the openness of the countryside and furthermore will progress extensive urbanisation (site and street lighting, pavements, bus shelters etc.,) into a green field/agricultural area. Incidentally the land identified is high-quality agricultural land under continuous arable use producing food.

The criteria seeks to achieve integration with the local community however the proposed site is 1.5 miles from any sizeable local community but conversely is adjacent to five isolated houses and thus the settled community would not be integrated rather inundated. My wife and I would not wish to continue residing in our property because of concerns over the large and very different type of community placed on us and this will apply for other older residents affected as well.

Aside from the areas covered by the criteria should the site be established it would have highly undesirable effects on local businesses and result in the closure of the Exhibition Centre and potential harm to other businesses as a result of customer perception. With the closure of the Exhibition Centre its large car park would be a major attraction to other gypsies and travellers from a far wider area and a situation might arise where an illegal site is created vastly larger than the proposed official site. This would give us as landowners and Warwick District Council far greater problems than currently encountered with these communities and in all probability, as the landowner, we would be obliged to sell to the illegal occupants as the only option open to us.

The siting would also not be in the wider interests of Leamington Spa and Warwick being located on two important roads carrying substantial national traffic consequently the highly visible site would be detrimental to the reputation and attraction of this high-profile tourist area.

The proposed site is presently a pleasant rural country area which whilst adjacent to two busy roads nevertheless is still very much rural countryside in aspect. The proposed site will totally change the area and will result in unsightly and irreversible urbanisation and creates potential for further ribbon development that Warwick District Council will find it difficult to contest.

I sincerely trust that Council officers and Councillors will look carefully at the wider picture and potential for further problems that this site presents and indeed (due to their proximity) the two Harbury Lane sites present when making their judgements.
